Leaders and Policies of the Polish Government in Exile 1939-1990

The Polish Government in Exile, founded in Paris in October 1939, existed until 22 December 1990 when President Ryszard Kaczorowski passed the symbols of state to the popularly elected Lech Wałęsa at the Royal Castle in Warsaw. During the period of its existence, leaders of the Government in Exile sought to preserve the legal continuity of the Polish Second Republic. This volume offers insight into a lesser known aspect of European history. It provides valuable historical and biographical information on Polish leaders who, between 1940 and 1990, resided in London. The book will be of interest to a broad readership, including students of the Cold War.
